Award Criteria

- A recipient must be a member of the Friends of the Royal Oak Public Library. The member may also be an employee of the Library, but can be recognized only for volunteer activities.
- A recipient must have volunteered for a minimum of five years and, during those years, shown exceptional dedication and commitment to the Friends and the Library.
 - Exceptional dedication is demonstrated by volunteering significantly more hours than the average hours worked in one year by most volunteers in the shop and sorting room.
 - Exceptional commitment is demonstrated by volunteering for special projects, being available to assist and fill-in when needed, working with a positive attitude, and otherwise putting the Library's interests first.
- Recipients are eligible to receive this award more than once, in non-consecutive years, when service to the Library merits.

<p>Selling (Existing group seeks additional help):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Retrieve pile of books categorized by potential buyer • Scan books into buyer's website • Print packing slip and shipping label to complete sale • Pack box • Drop off at USPS, UPS, and/or FedEx 	<p>Shop Logistics:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Retrieve sign-in sheets (sorting room and shop), deposit sheets, dealer logs at month end • Stock shop with forms and office supplies • Keep forms and job guidelines up to date and make sure they are available to volunteers
<p>Community Outreach:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Facilitate table w/materials at outreach programs, i.e. RO Glass and Clay Show, library outdoor concerts • Update communication team and board as needed. 	<p>Sorting Room Inventory Maintenance:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review sorting room shelves and ensure books are recycled that are in poor condition or outdated.
