## **Additional Incidents and Information**

### **Suspect arrested after Domestic Assault and Vehicle Theft**

A 32-year-old Detroit man is facing felony charges after assaulting his ex-girlfriend and stealing her vehicle. On Tuesday January 7, 2020 around 8:00 p.m., Royal Oak officers were called to Ascension-Oakland Hospital in Madison Heights to speak with a victim who reported she was injured after being assaulted.

Officers learned the victim was driving with the suspect on Stephenson Highway near E. Eleven Mile. The suspect became upset after he discovered she was talking with another man. The suspect struck her in the face several times with his fist. She was able to exit the vehicle and the suspect drove away in her vehicle, leaving her on the side of the road.

The victim suffered an injury to her jaw, lacerations to her face area and received two loose teeth from the assault. The victim was treated and released from the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries.

Detectives and officers from the Special Investigation Unit quickly followed up on information obtained from the victim. Early Thursday afternoon, the suspect, along with the victim's vehicle, was located at a home in Detroit and taken into custody

The suspect is facing charges of Aggravated Felonious Domestic Assault, Unlawful Driving Away of an Automobile and Larceny from Person.

Now that winter is here residents and visitors are reminded of Royal Oak's Snow Emergency Ordinance. Snow Emergency conditions are generally defined as ***a snowfall of four inches or more and will remain in effect until your street has been plowed.*** All vehicles on residential streets are to be removed or will be ticketed or towed. Vehicles are to remain off the streets until plow trucks have gone through the area. Once a snow emergency is called and plowing begins, it takes approximately 24-36 hours to plow all city streets, depending on how much snow has fallen.
