The Convention was a smashing success due to the excited participation of both the students and the faculty. Most important it was realistic and proved to be a valuable learning experience for all.



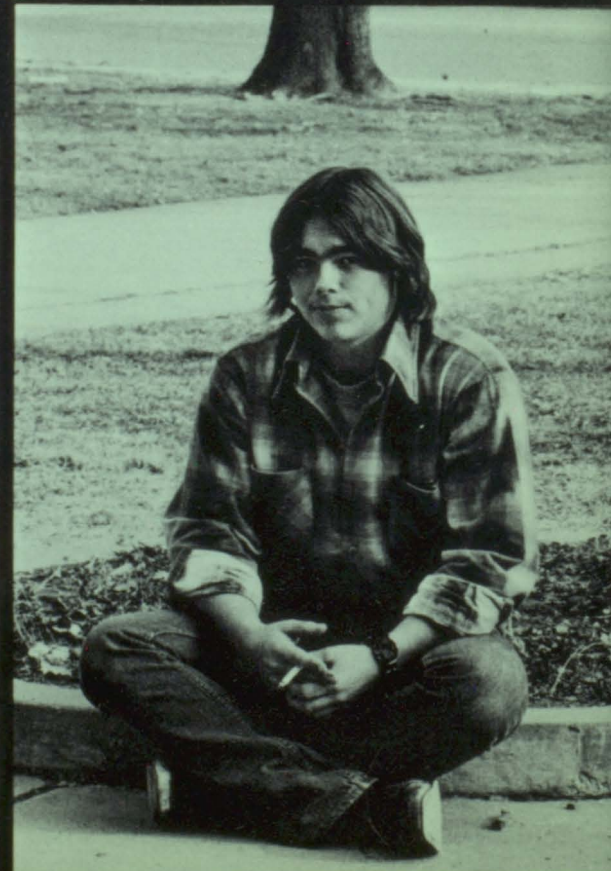
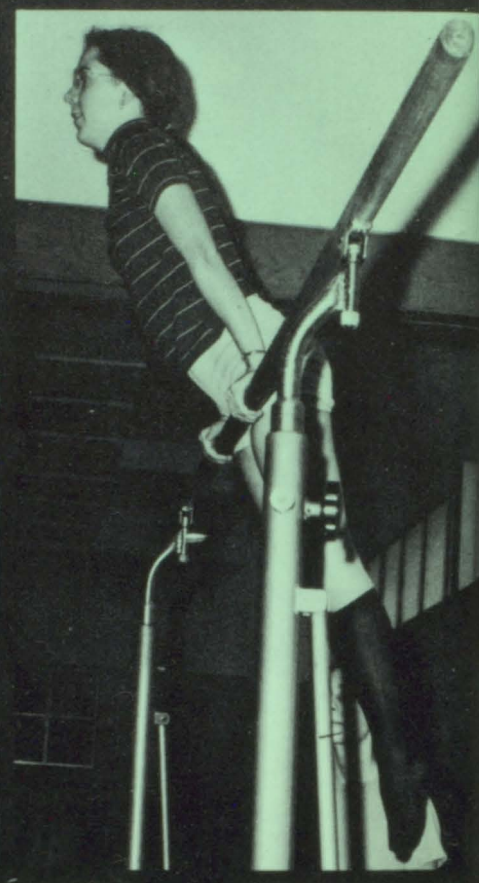
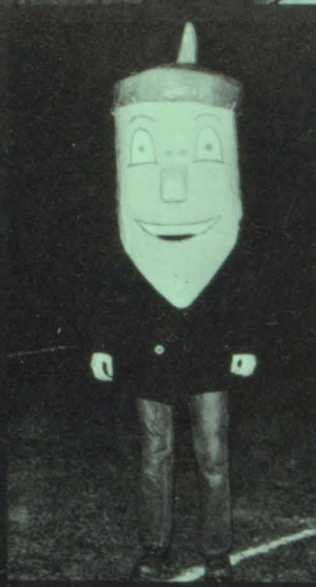
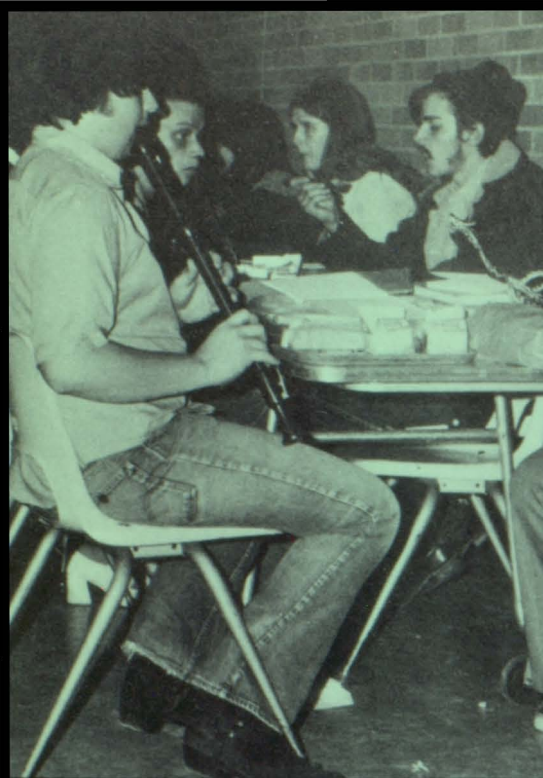

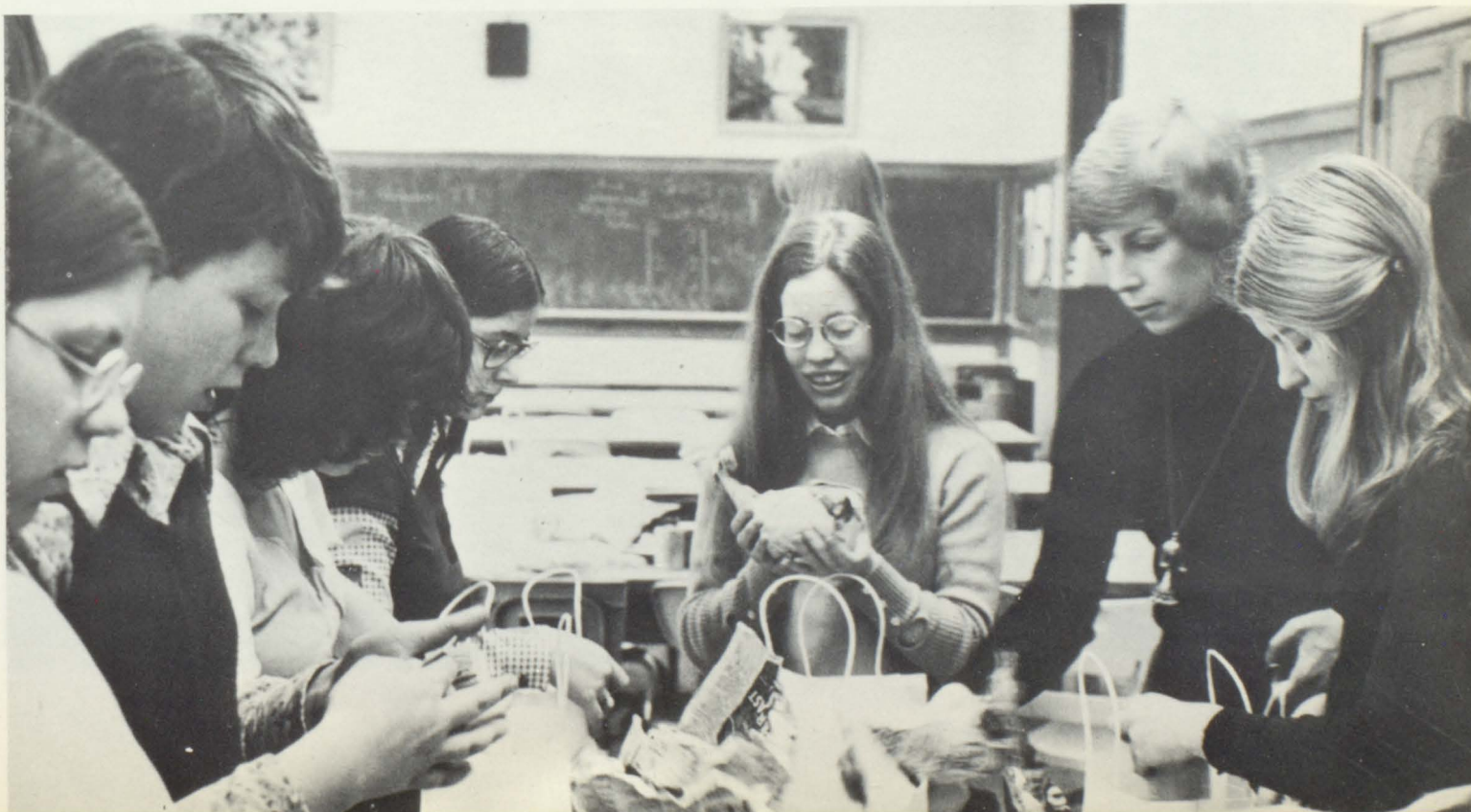

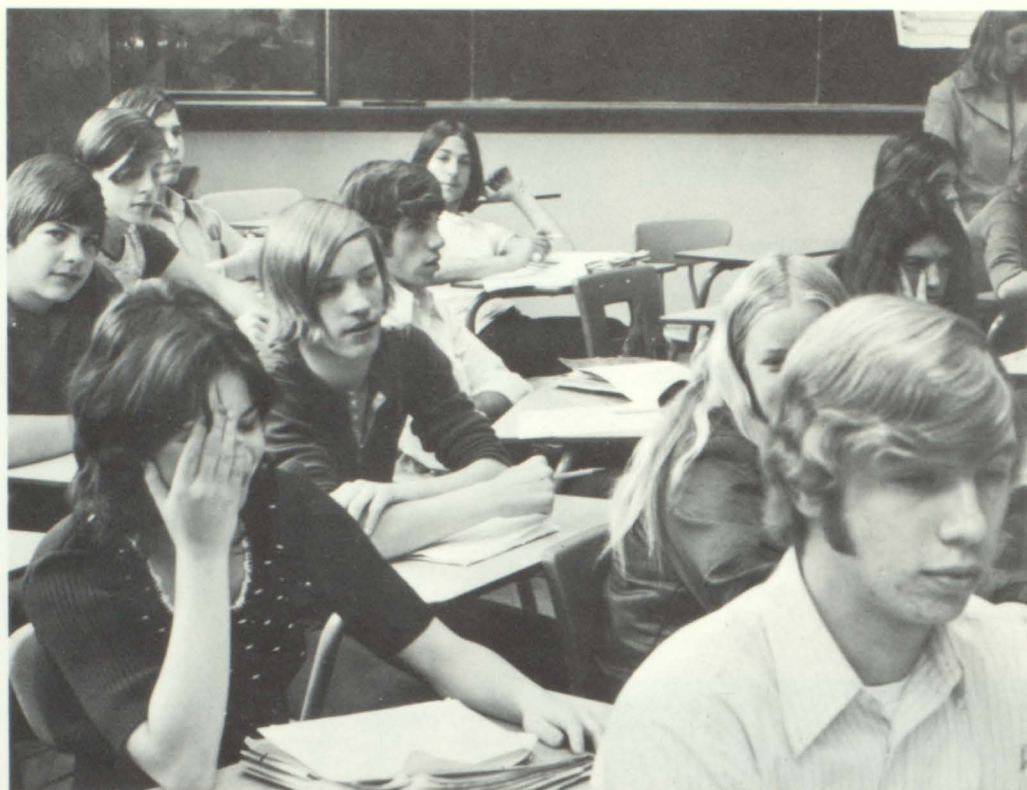
