
Debate Team

So when the weather gets bad, the band doesn't pack up and quit until next year. They get **BUSY** on a new season!





The Dondero Drama Club presented "The Diary of Anne Frank" in our auditorium on November 16 and 17.








Preceeding the game a pep assembly was held and the Pep Club introduced their new mascot, an elephant, named after a coach of our own heart, Ivy.



The club also took their annual weekend trip to Caberfae in February.






Keeping things together and representing the whole student body is the basic job held by Senate.


Senate is a group of concerned and involved students who work together for the better of the school with Dondero's young people in mind.

The club has visited places such as Veterinarian's Hospital, the medical facilities at Wayne, and Grace School of Nursing. They have also been exposed to in-


fluential visitors from the medical profession.




