This year each of the foreign language classes caroled in one of the German class rooms. The big event of the year was the Foreign Language Festival which was put on at the end of the year by all of the language classes.



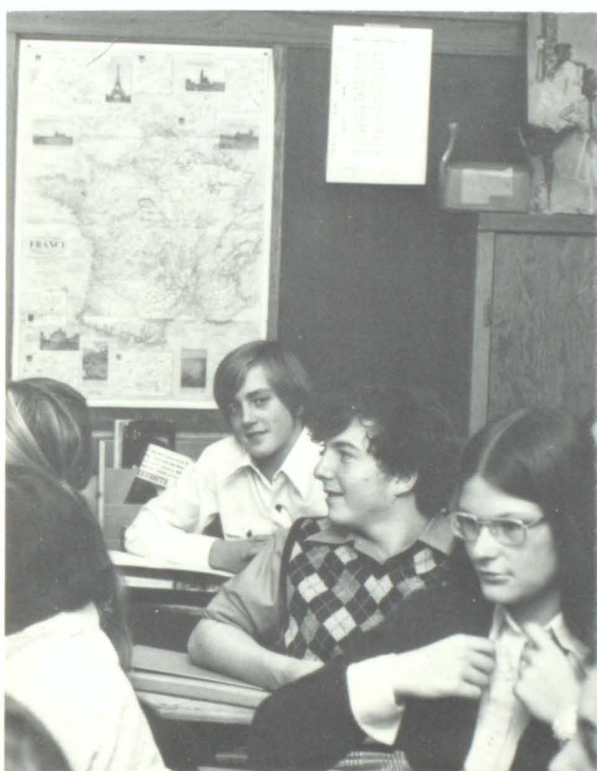

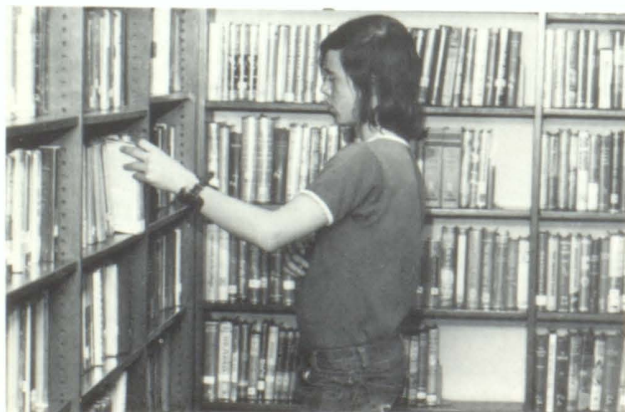

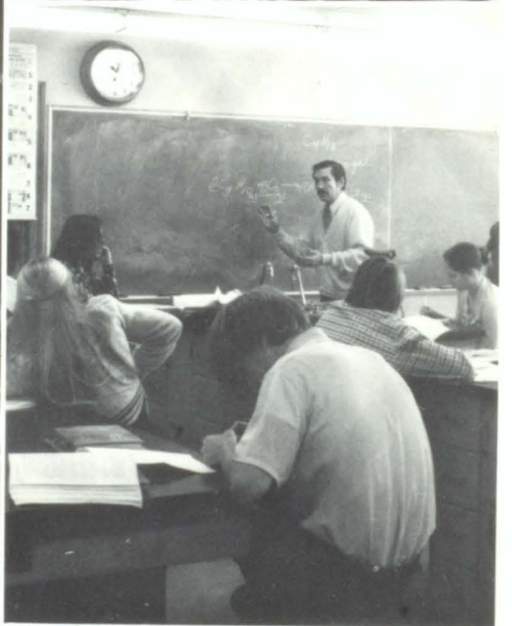

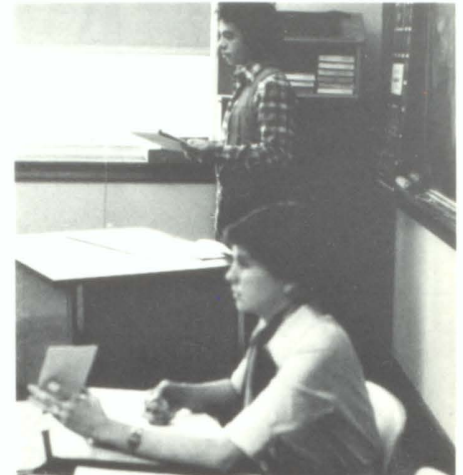

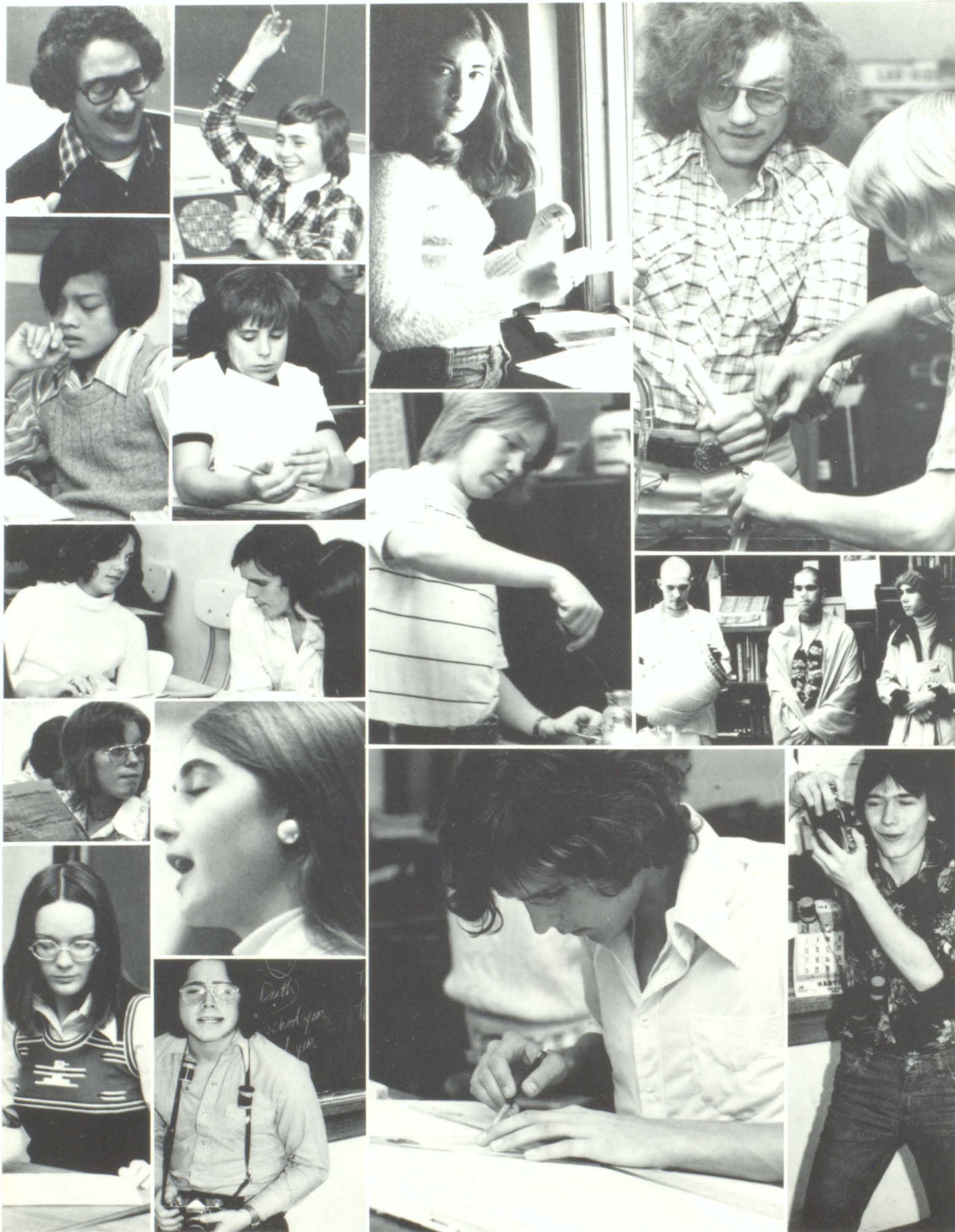

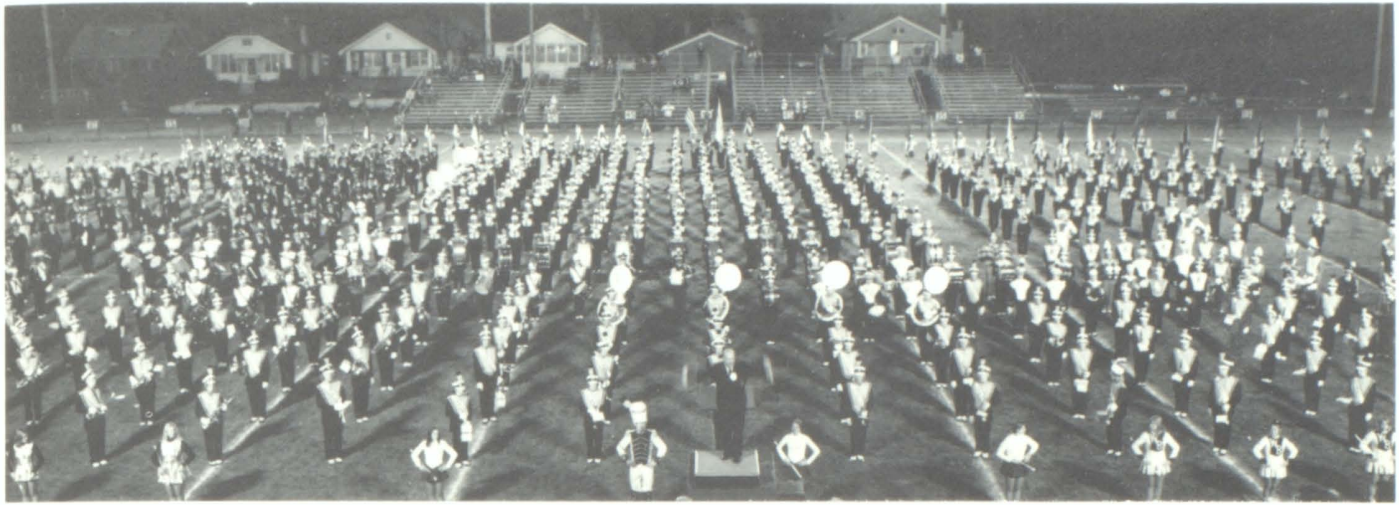

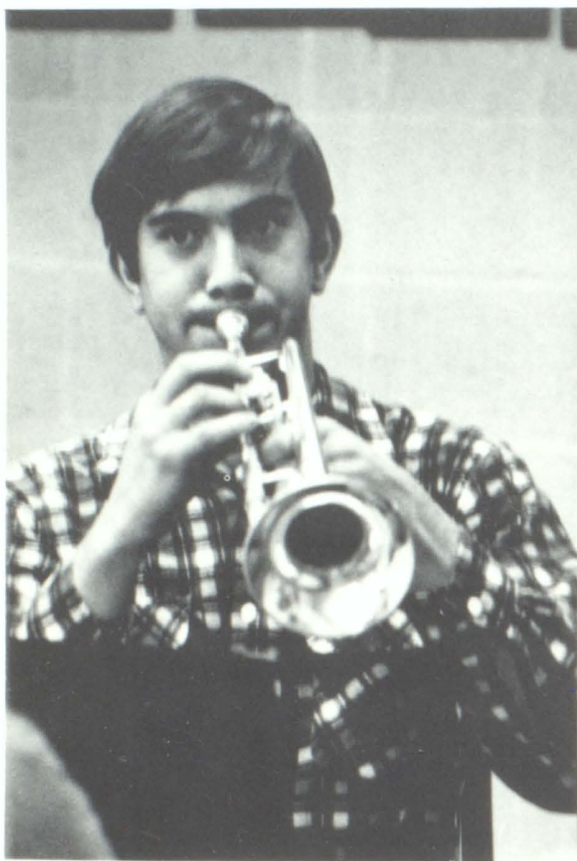

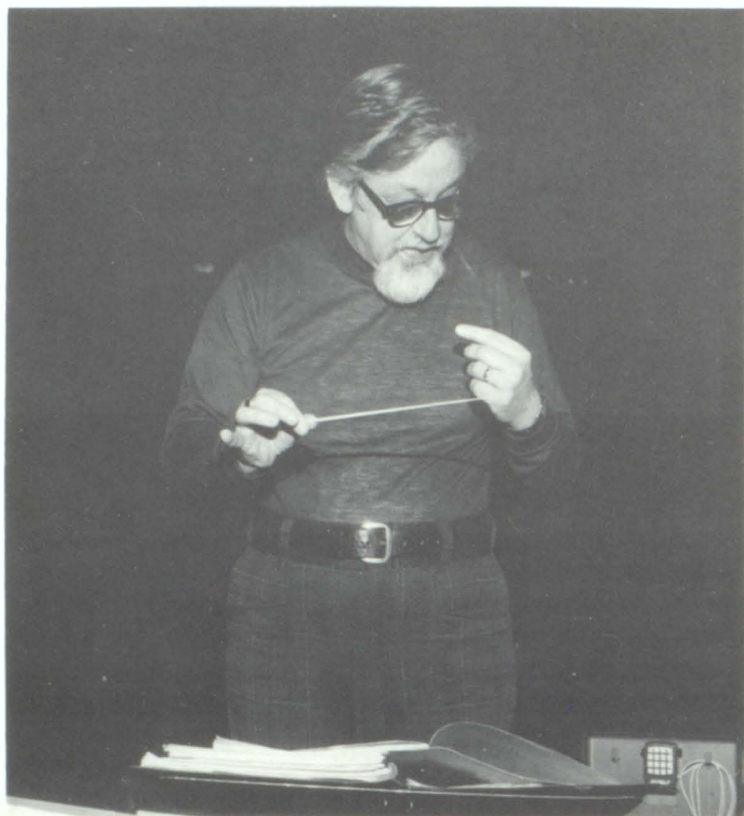

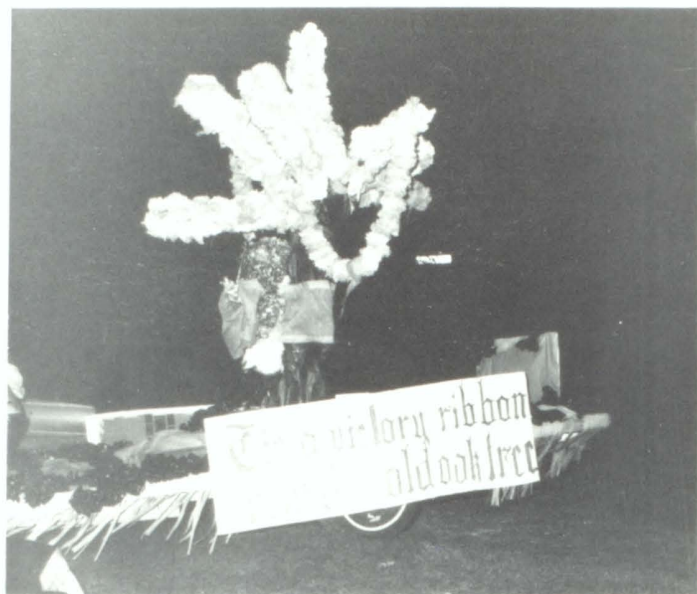


HOMECOMING 1974
