




Turning out a school newspaper is not as simple as one might think. The Acorners have once again had a successful year.

The work of this year's students has made the OAK like no other book ever published at Dondero.




Words Show Expression

A new project for the group was "Revelations," a magazine which came out in March and contained **Genesis** members work-exclusively.








This year's resolution was "Resolved: That the Federal Government should adopt a program that will significantly increase the energy independence of the U.S."


In the Warren Woods Novice League Chris Dunne and Jim Schoettle won top school speaker honors.




The 1978-79 Forensics Team was smaller this year, but their enthusiasm was great. The team went to three tournaments this year and competed against many other high schools.

The spirit and success of the team was not only due to the talent of each student, but to their advisor, Mrs. Fleetwood.





The Math Department offers a wide variety of classes suited for its students.


Statistics and Computer Science are two newly developed courses to advance the technique of teaching math.

Social Studies Develops the Mind



A Language of Communication


There are approximately thirty-three English classes offered this year that enroll about 1900 students.

The English Department is separated into basically two sections. First those that are product orientated such as Filmmaking and Performing Arts. This year Mr. Hartsoe took on quite a load. He is the director of all five choirs—over 300 students.







There are four Art Classes altogether, although they are very individual classes. In Art I, which is an annual course, students learn basic art procedures such as color theory, perspective drawing, figure drawing, and lettering. Art II, which is also an annual course, teaches three-dimensional art, sculpting, carving, paper structure, and printing. In Advanced Art students use the skills and techniques learned in Art I and Art II and work on various projects throughout the year which last 3 to 4 weeks each. If you like to make things but don't wish for an annual course, there is Arts and Crafts which is a semester course that lets you work with macrame, decoupage, papermache, and clay mosaics.

For Seniors with exceptional talent there is a Senior Art Contest. It is open to any senior that has had one Art Class. You need 15 pieces of art work to enter. They may be accumulated over a period of years. Entries are required to be mixed with much variety, such as: painting, clay, sculpture and/or weaving. The judging takes place the last week of May. Faculty and/or students are asked to vote. The prize varies from year to year. Money, a gift, a certificate or any combination may be presented to the winner.


















The wrestling team had another fine season this year. The team has compiled an 8-2-1 win-loss record, while winning its first wrestling tournament in school history.
