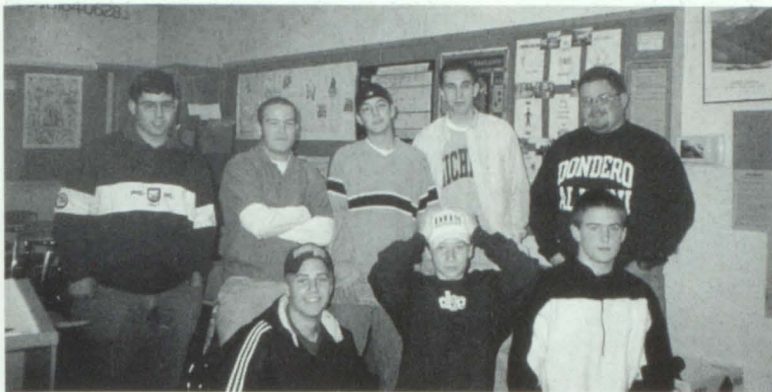

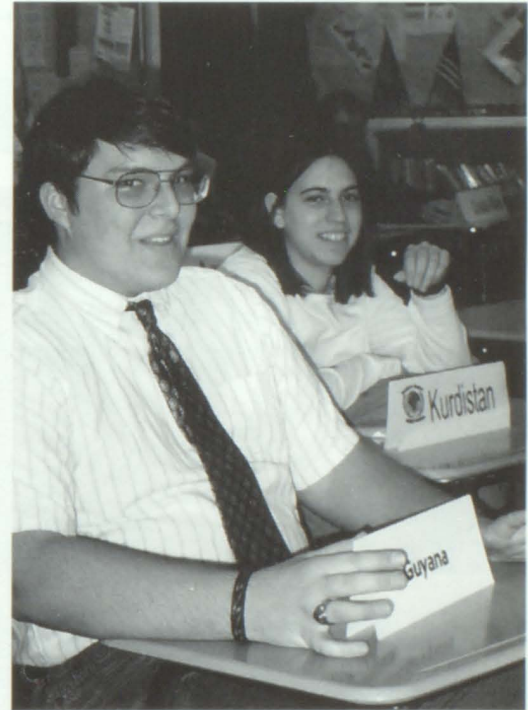

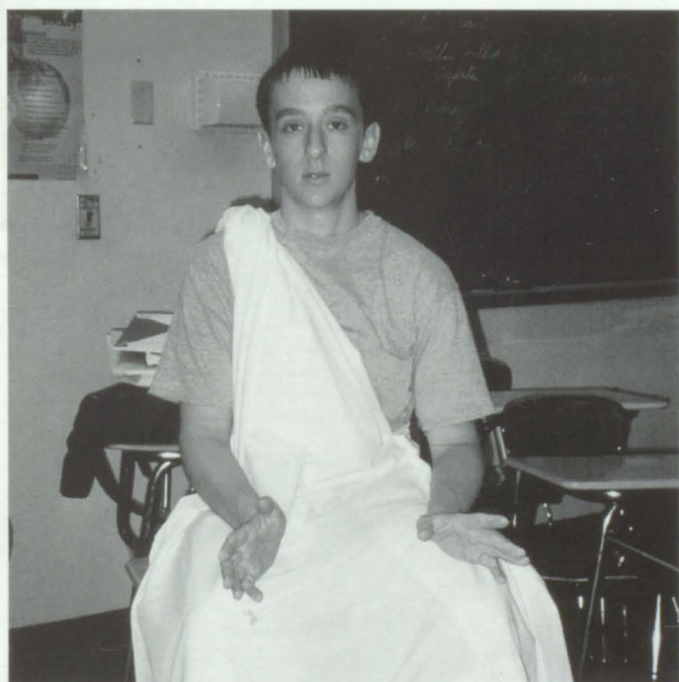

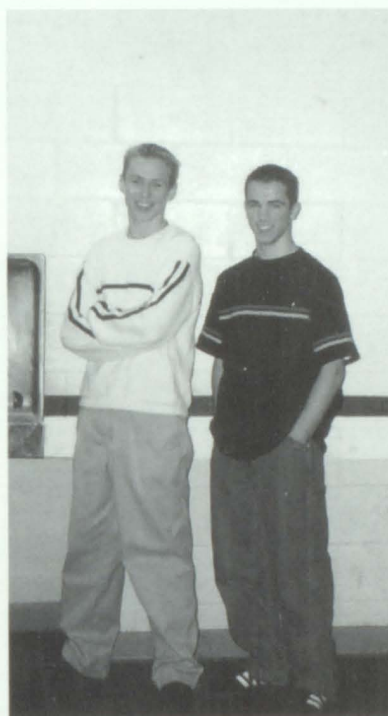

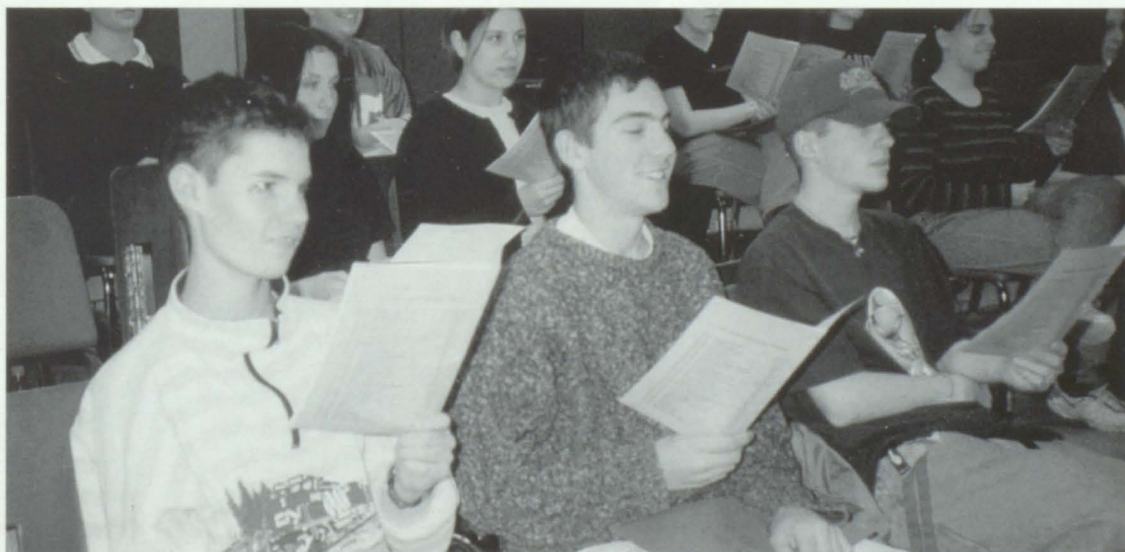

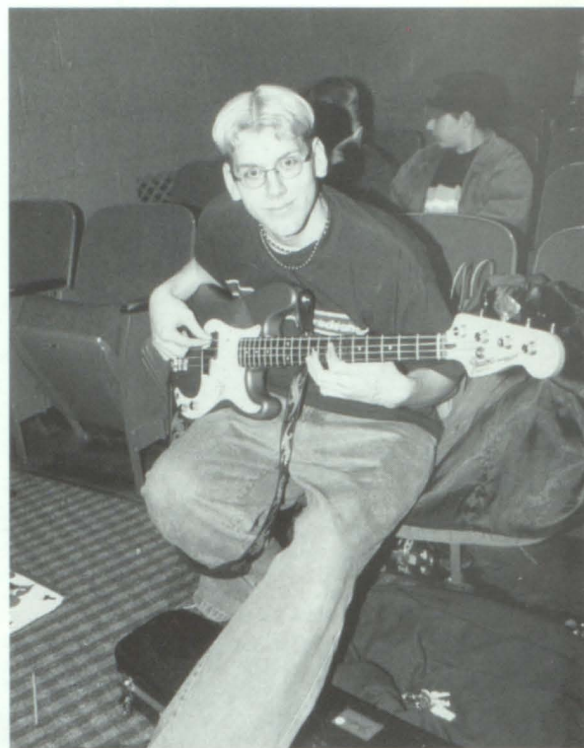

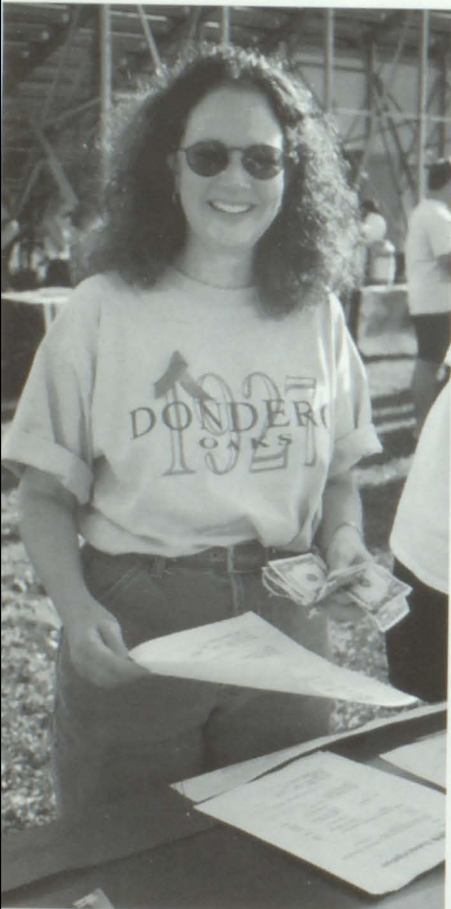

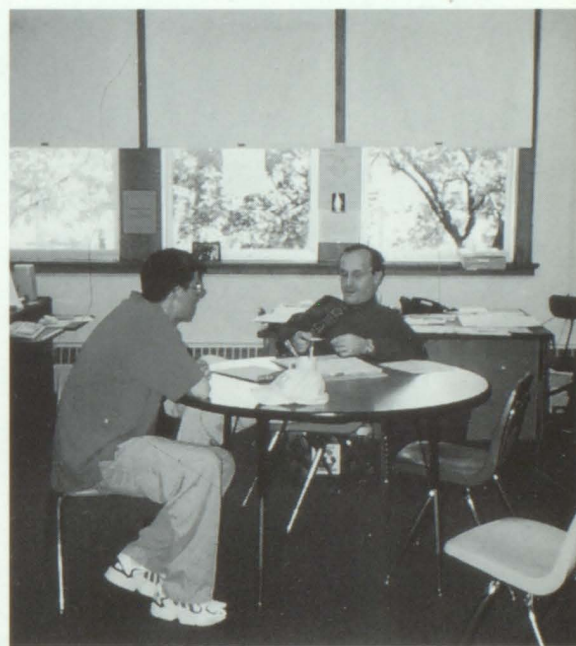

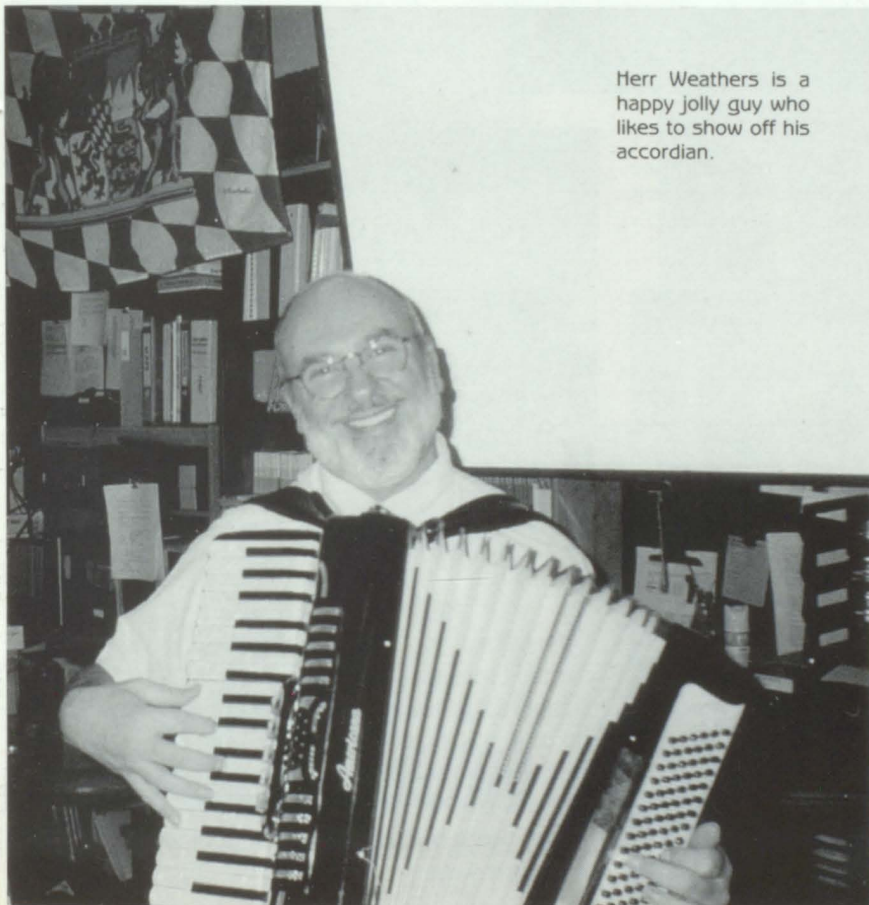

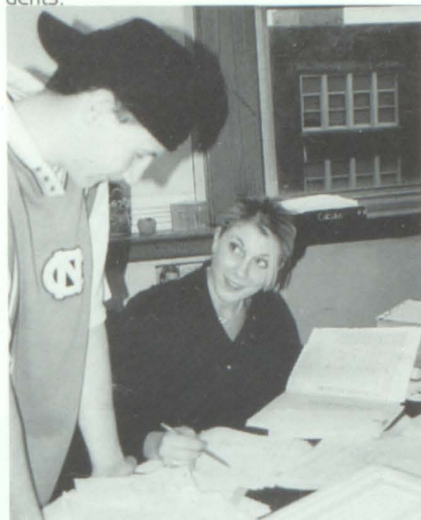

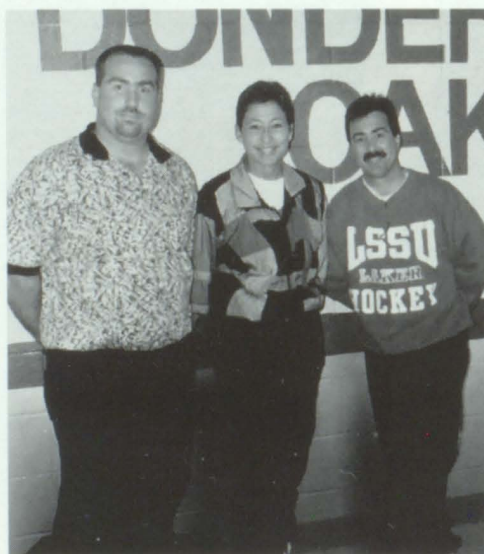


Above: Mr. Godzinski waits for his class to respond to the mind- boggling question he just asked them.

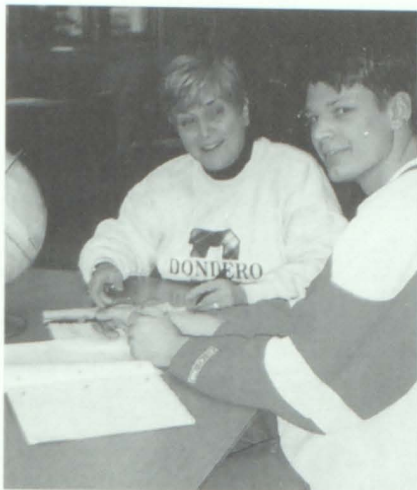

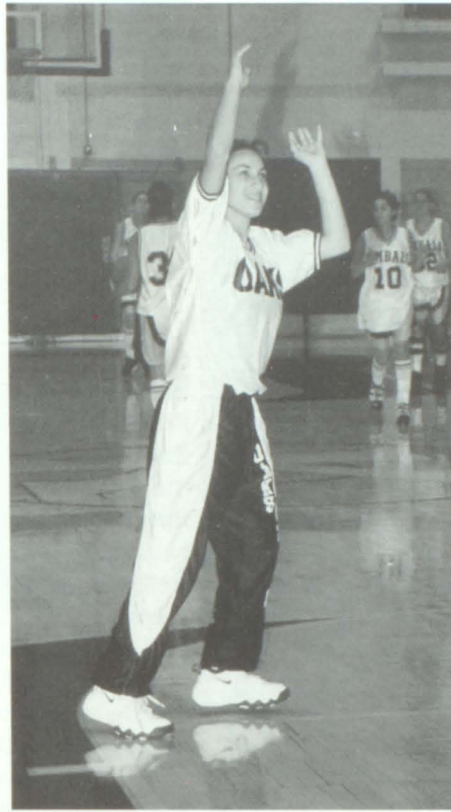

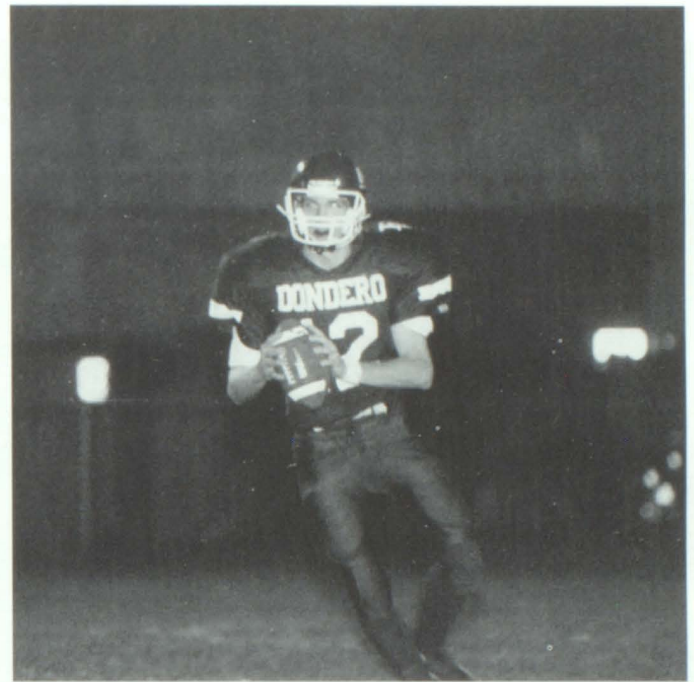

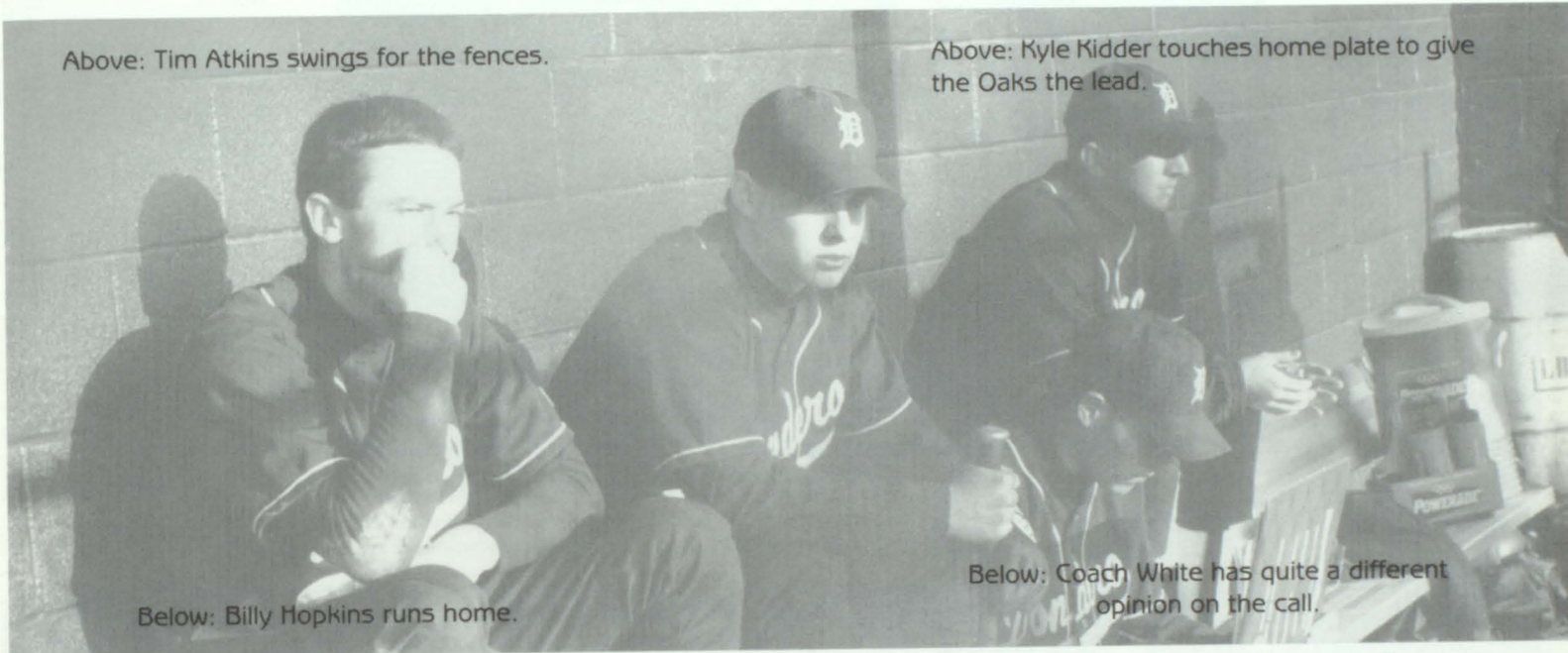

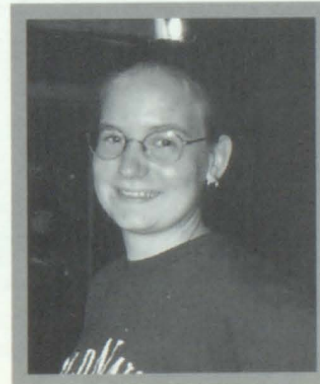
Drama
